NEWSWEEK Ranks Austin Top 10 City for Recession Recovery

Austin claimed a Top 10 spot in NEWSWEEK's 2010 list. The magazine noted "businesses have been flocking to Texas for a generation, and that trend is unlikely to slow soon."

NEWSWEEK also points out Texas is home to more fortune 500 companies than any other state including New York. Austin boasted the strongest job growth in NEWSWEEK's Top 10, both last year and over the decade.

Forbes Ranks Austin #1 "Best City for Young Adults"
